Your safety, how much work you get done, and whether the job gets finished on schedule, can all depend on good housekeeping near and in your work areas.

• Wash / Hygiene

A great place to start when thinking about a clean work area is with yourself!

- Always Wash your hands when returning from the restroom.
 - Practice good personal hygiene while at work to avoid the spread of contamination, illness, and allergens.
- Organize / Clean

• A cluttered work area can cause workers to trip, slip, or step on sharp objects. Always clean an item after use, and ensure it is returned to its proper place.

• When things are organized, less time is wasted trying to find equipment and materials needed.
